Mr Jin Liqun Chairman of Supervisory Board of CIC and Central Huijin

- Mr. Jin Liqun is the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of China Investment Corporation (CIC), and Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of Central Huijin Investment Ltd. Prior to this, he served as the Vice Minister of Finance, Vice President of Asian Development Bank, Alternative Executive Director of China to the World Bank Group, and member of the Monetary Policy Committee of the People's Bank of China.
- As Vice Minister of Finance, who was in charge of international economic affairs and finance, Mr. Jin managed issuance of 1bn USD sovereign bond in 1997 Asian Financial Crisis, and under direct leading of State Council, he participated in a series of key reforms on China's finance sector on behalf of Ministry of Finance. He served as Vice President of Asian Development Bank (ADB) for five years, and was the first Chinese for this position as vice-minister level, and also the first Chinese Vice President since establishment of ADB.
- During the past two decades, especially since 1997 Asian Financial Crisis, Mr. Jin has been active in international economic affairs. He participated in various bilateral and multilateral economic and financial forums, such as Sino-U.S. Joint Commission on Commerce and Trade, China-UK Economic and Financial Dialogue, APEC Finance Ministers Meeting, ASEAN "10+3" Meeting, and G20 Finance Ministers Meeting.
